

11.2 Support of arts and heritage

11.2.6 CU delivers projects to preserve intangible cultural heritage such as local folklore, traditions, language, and knowledge, this can include the heritage of displaced communities.

Cairo University (through its faculties, research centres and journals) actively ran research, documentation and outreach activity concerned with intangible cultural heritage (folklore, popular literature, oral traditions, local knowledge, language work, fieldwork guides and seminars). Below, I summarise the evidence:

- 1- The 1st evidence: a **press release** titled "The Center for Foreign Languages and Specialized Translation at Cairo University honors the winners of the 'Egyptian Folk Tales in World Languages' competition."
- 2- The 2nd evidence: **Centre for Popular Heritage Studies** (Faculty of Arts) — an active research/teaching centre at CU that organises seminars, workshops and public events about popular (folk) heritage. This is a core institutional vehicle for recording and analysing ICH.
- 3- The 3rd evidence: a **press release** titled: Establishment of a UNESCO Chair in Science and Technology for Heritage Preservation at Cairo University.
- 4- The 4th evidence: a **press release** titled: Opening of the Center for Archaeological Studies and World Heritage in Luxor".
- 5- The 5th evidence: a **press release** titled: "After their registration as antiquities": The history of the Clock Tower and the dome of Cairo University
