

14.2 Supporting aquatic ecosystems through education

14.2.3 CU as a body offers educational outreach activities for local or national communities to raise awareness about overfishing, illegal, unreported and unregulated fishing and destructive fishing practices.

Cairo University does run aquaculture / fish-farming training and farmer-focused activities (which promote better husbandry and sustainable aquaculture practices) (notably via the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine and participation in the Tilapia Welfare project):

- 1- **The 1st evidence:** the report of the faculty of veterinary Medicine CU, 2024. See p.1.
- 2- **The 2nd evidence:** Cairo University joined the Tilapia Welfare Project (early-2024 partnership with FAI and partner organizations) which explicitly provides e-learning and training tools for fish farmers across Egypt to improve tilapia husbandry, welfare and production practices. That project reaches producers and is community-facing (industry/farmers).
- 3- **The 3rd evidence:** There are multiple regional/sector training programmes and online courses on aquaculture / water quality in 2023–2024 (SEC/WorldFish / sector events) in which Egyptian universities (including CU staff or students) take part — these are industry/professional capacity-building activities relevant to sustainable aquaculture.
